Audition

(Required for: Acting for Film & TV)

2 audition pieces required

Contrasting monologues (must be from a play), 1 contemporary and 1 Shakespeare, or 2 Contemporary (1 dramatic and 1 comedic). Each piece should be no longer than 2 minutes; the applicant should know both monologues without the use of text (on paper or computer). Audition can be done in-person, over Zoom, or pre-recorded and submitted as a video file (through WeTransfer).

Note: Portfolios/Auditions are *not* required for admission into our Web Development & Design or Art Foundation programs.

If you have successfully completed our Art Foundation program or a diploma/degree related to the program you are applying for, a portfolio or audition may not be needed.
